





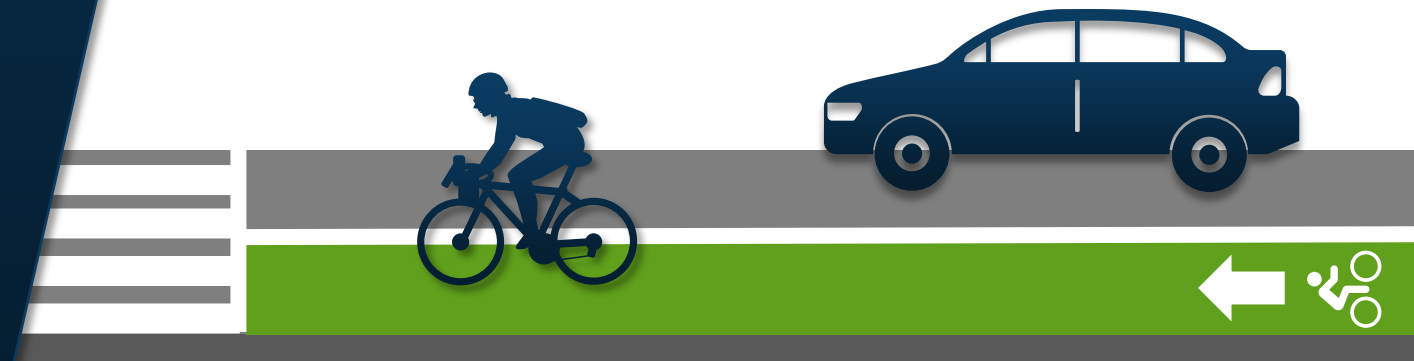

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SS4A Program Overview



Welcome to the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A)

How was SS4A established?

The [Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act \(IIJA\) \(Public Law 117-58\)](#) established the SS4A competitive grant program, with \$5 billion in appropriated funds over five years, FY2022- FY2026.

What is SS4A's purpose?

The SS4A program funds regional, local, and Tribal initiatives through grants to prevent roadway deaths and serious injuries.

How much funding has been spent?

Combining the FY22, FY23, and FY24, SS4A has provided \$2.9 billion in Federal funding to more than 1,600 communities in all 50 States and Puerto Rico. Almost \$2 billion is available for future funding rounds.

Awards will improve roadway safety planning for around **75** percent of the nation's population.

About **half** of communities awarded are new direct Federal funding recipients to USDOT.

44 percent of communities receiving funding have populations under 50,000.

SS4A Grant Recipient Roadmap

1. Onboarding

- Receive award notification
- Connect with your SS4A point of contact (POC)

2. Grant Agreement Execution

- Work with your POC to complete and execute your grant agreement
- Aim to execute grant agreement within 12 months of award notification

3. Performing the Project Work, Getting Reimbursed, and Reporting

- Complete project work within period of performance
- Submit required reports
- Request reimbursement for eligible project costs

4. Project Closeout

- End of grant's period of performance (PoP)
- Complete final reimbursement and reporting requirements within 120 days
- The project will be officially closed out within one year of the PoP end date.

- FTA will also hold an official kick-off meeting with grant recipients to discuss the program requirements and answer questions.
- Recipients will be introduced to their primary FTA Point of Contact, who will be the main point of contact for the duration of the project.

The Clearinghouse is a publicly available website:

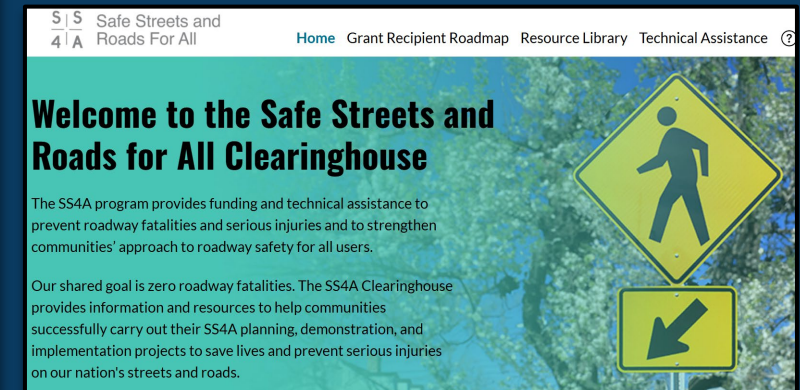

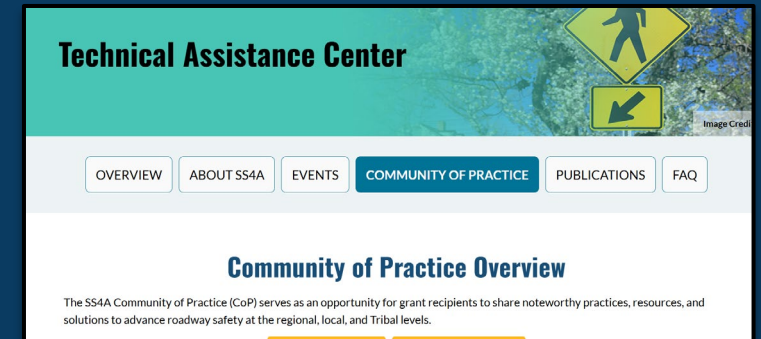

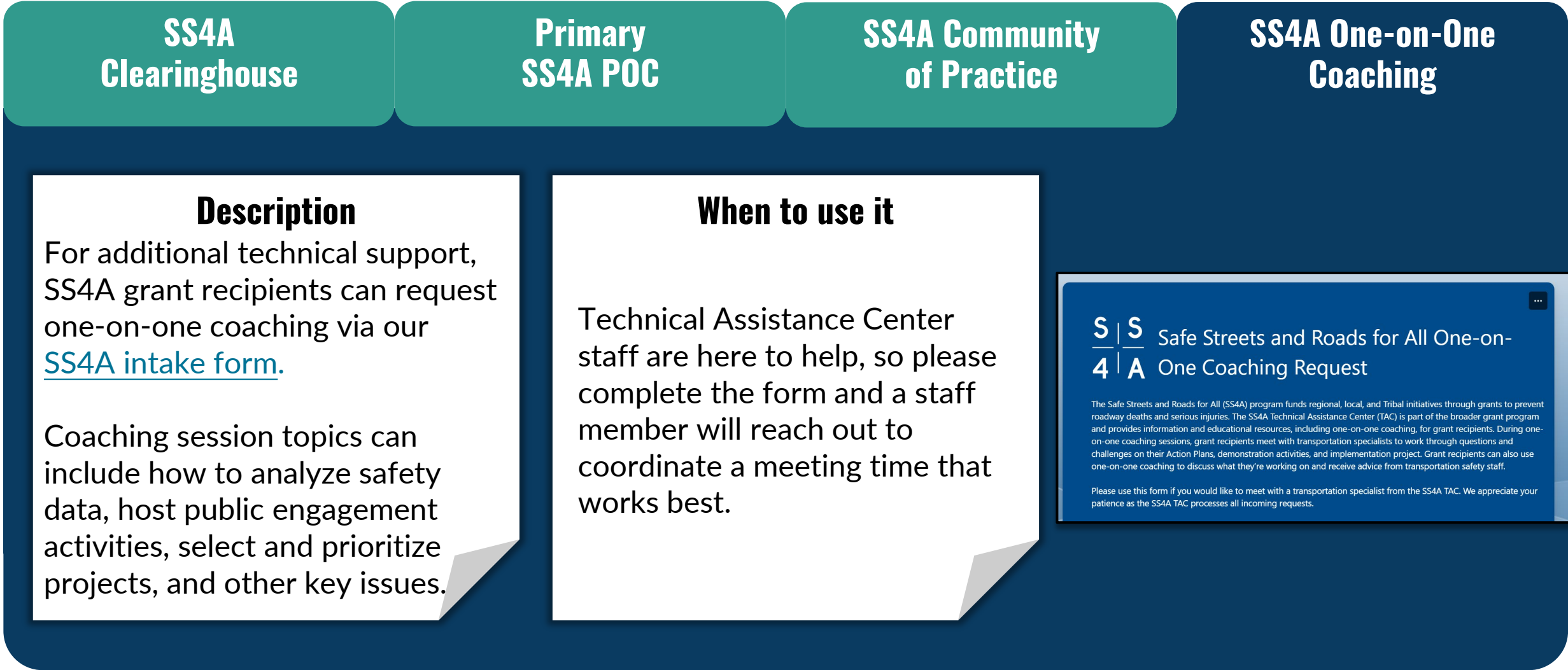
